Who can take OWL?

This year-long course is offered to youth who will be at least 13 on or before September 1, 2019

When/where does the OWL class meet?

Sunday mornings at Horizon from 10:45am-12:00pm late August - late May with time off duing major holidays, spring break etc.

Two overnight lock ins will also be scheduled each semester

Is there a fee?

No, OWL is a ministry of Horizon UU and is supported entirely by the members' pledges.

Do I have to be a church member for my teen to take OWL?

No, OWL is open to the public, although preference will be given to the children of church members.
